• When the first air strikes started US President George W Bush said:

"We did not ask for this mission, but we will fulfil it, to disrupt the use of Afghanistan as a terrorist base of operations and to attack the military capability of the Taliban regime"

- First targets → military sites belonging the Taliban group.
 - → Training camps for al-Qaeda
 - → the terror group run by 9/11

Osama Bin Laden, was also hit.

Still more than 15.000 US soldiers are on the territories of Afghanistan





- In the last decade, at least 41000 people lost their lives. This number with 7.5% constituted by women and 17.9% by children.
- Only in the first half of 2018, 149 civilians were killed, 204 got injured and in total 338 died in the air force attacks.
- In 2018, the United Nations Assistance Mission in Afghanistan documented the highest ever recorded civilian deaths, including the highest ever recorded number of children killed in the conflict.
- More than 360,000 internally displaced by the conflict
- According to the UNHCR, the UN refugee agency, there are almost 2.5 million registered refugees from Afghanistan: the second-largest refugee population in the world.

- However, no progress has been made in the history of the longest war by the US according to the Afghans.
- When "Around 150,000 US and NATO troops and hundreds of thousands of Afghan soldiers and policemen failed to win the war against the Taliban militants, which could be expressed in thousands. Why?" has been asked by the high Peace Congress Member Muhammed İsmail Kasımyar he answers on his own "whether they didn't want it, or they couldn't"
- Haci Ekrem, who is an hamal in the old city of Kabul, earning an average of 4 dollars per day states "Aid from the outside world was shared among senior government officials before reaching the poor. They went into their pockets. The foreigners did not correct the situation. They must go now"

- Not only Afghans, the war caused spending of \$ 132 billion so far in reconstruction of Afghanistan, which is much more than the money spent in Western Europe after the Second World War.
- In addition, \$ 750 billion was spent on military operations.
 Washington has recently announced that it will transfer \$ 4 billion to the Afghan security forces.

Afganistan savaşının ABD ordusuna **2001 - 2019 yılları** arasındaki maaliyeti




What Other Problems?

Women

- Seeking work and safety, countless Afghan men have fled the country or died during the war. But the situation of the women left behind, without their husbands or brothers and without their protection as the Taliban continue to tighten their grip, got worse.
- According to a survey found 41% of Afghans want to leave the country. This rises to nearly 50% among women, reflecting Afghanistan's status as one of the toughest countries in the world to be female.
- With little education or money of their own 80% of Afghan women are out of the workforce and 91% have only a primary education or less– the chances of women finding work elsewhere are slim.
- The ones who attempt to leave, often risk everything.
